Recommendations and notes from the County Executive Grants Team:

- Program descriptions are extremely important. Be clear on why you want the funds. Be clear with your intent.
- ► Clearly state the program outcome metrics and background, especially if the program has been funded in the past.
- ► If the program is an expansion of a program from outside Montgomery County, be sure to state your outcome metrics from existing program locations.
- ▶ Don't submit applications at the last minute. Submit early.

Recommendations and notes from the County Council Grants Team:

- Contact Carolyn Chen for feedback or meetings. She is a full time employee working on grants.
- ► The Community Grants is a pool of funds determined by the County Executive then goes to the County Council side for review.
- ► The County Council also reviews Capital Grants.
- ▶ 85 people review the applications. 8-10 people read each application.
- ▶ It is important to show matching funds to demonstrate that County grants are leveraged.



Recommendations and notes from the Office of Legislative Oversight:

- ► The Office of Legislative Oversight is writing a report that will be published on September 25. The report will recommend changes to the County Grants process.
- ▶ Public forums with opportunities for public testimony will be on October 9. Worksessions on the report will be held on October 11 and October 29.
- ► Recommendations may include:
 - Multi-year grants
 - o Better definition of the intent of the grant program by elected officials.

Suggestions from the Nonprofit Community:

- ► Provide structure/consistency on indirect costs.
- ► Priorities/outcomes align with County priorities.
- ► Use expert reviewers for specific sectors
- ▶ Subject matter experts brief citizen reviewers at the start of the grant process.
- ► There should be one application and one reporting form.
- ► Allow for multi-year grants.
